Safety Star Students

At school your child has been learning about electricity and electrical safety through Essential Energy's Electricity Safety Week program. Here's a tip to help keep you and your family safe:

Stay away from anything that may be in contact with a powerline, such as fences or trees, as they are conductors of electricity. Be aware that electricity can arc to surrounding objects and possibly you if you are too close. You can be seriously injured without actually touching the powerline.

So far, our Safety Stars have learnt that water and electricity do not mix and to always keep electrical appliances away from water.

If you see a fallen or hanging powerline, stay at least 8 metres away from it and tell an adult or call triple zero.

Make sure a licensed electrical contractor is used to replace any damaged powerpoints, cords or fittings.
