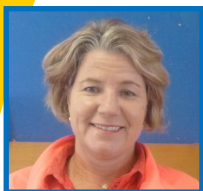

### 100 Years of Railway in Macksville

Amethyst and Blake represented our school at Macksville Railway Station this morning to help celebrate 100 Years of rail services in Macksville. They were lucky enough to meet the NSW Governor, Margaret Beazley.

The Official Opening of the Macksville Station didn't happen in 1919 because of an epidemic of Spanish flu. The flu affected 15 thousand people in Australia after World War 1.
